The dispute between the United States and Iran over Iran's nuclear program is a by-product of their decades long estrangement and mutual distrust. American foreign policy elites are in agreement that the Islamic Republic's apparent drive to gain the capacity to make nuclear weapons challenges U. S. hegemony in the Middle East, but they are divided as to how they should respond to the challenge. The Iranian regime, on the other hand, is determined to remain functionally independent and insists on its right to produce nuclear fuel for its reactors. The mainstream U. S. media coverage of the conflict focuses exclusively on Iran's nuclear program without paying much attention to the underlying issues involved in the dispute. While the European Union and the International Atomic Energy Agency want to resolve the problem through negotiations, it is not at all clear if the Bush Administration is ready to make the kind of concessions that a peaceful settlement of the conflict requires.
